### **G** – Gather for Prayer

*Father,*

*Forgive me for making less of you than I should. Remind me of your glorious splendor and help me to live accordingly.*

### **R** – Read the Text (Psalm 110)

*1 The Lord says to my Lord:*

*“Sit at My right hand*

*Until I make Your enemies a footstool for Your feet.”*

*2 The Lord will stretch forth Your strong scepter from Zion, saying,*

*“Rule in the midst of Your enemies.”*

*3 Your people [a]will volunteer freely in the day of Your power;*

*In holy array, from the womb of the dawn,*

*Your youth are to You as the dew.*

*4 The Lord has sworn and will not change His mind,*

*“You are a priest forever*

*According to the order of Melchizedek.”*

*5 The Lord is at Your right hand;*

*He will shatter kings in the day of His wrath.*

*6 He will judge among the nations,*

*He will fill them with corpses,*

*He will shatter the chief men over a broad country.*

*7 He will drink from the brook by the wayside;*

*Therefore He will lift up His head.*
